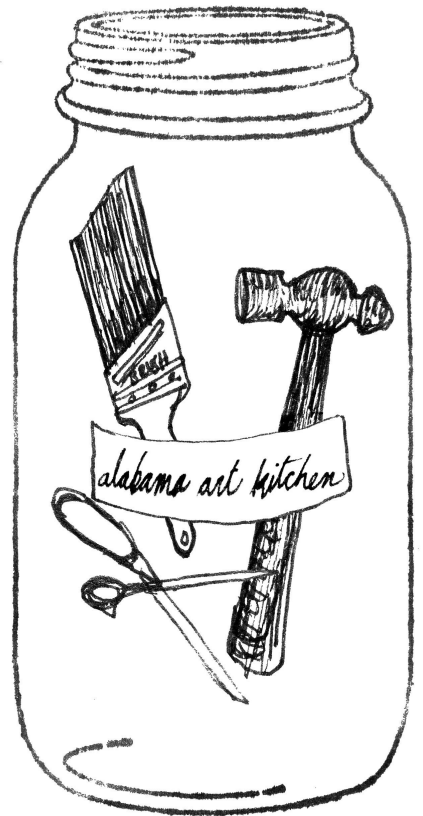

Ladyfest Deep South is a non-profit festival of feminist art and activism. This festival is a collaborative effort forged between University of Alabama students, faculty, and staff organizers and volunteers and the surrounding community of regional musicians and other artists, activists, do-it-yourself crafters, merchants, and growers. The festival is intended to bring attention to the richness of regional culture and the collaborative possibilities that exist between the university and the City of Tuscaloosa. This open, creative, and diverse art and music festival will generate support for local merchants, artists, performers, and relief organizations, as well as bring attention to the newly revitalized historic downtown district. Our mission is to provide a forum in which members of the community can learn about, celebrate, and encourage the artistic and organizational talents of those in the region who may or may not be recognized in the dominant cultural landscape. This participatory festival features performances by musicians, visual artists, writers, performance artists, and crafters, as well as youth programs and a multitude of workshops. Ladyfest Deep South proceeds will be donated to organizations that support the welfare of women and girls and promote local art/craft/DIY culture and meaningful activism—with an emphasis on supporting underserved or underrepresented groups.

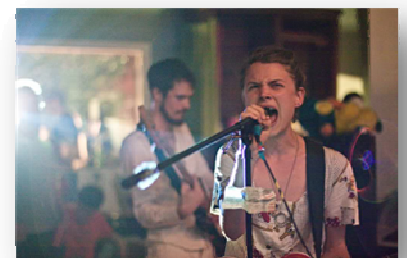


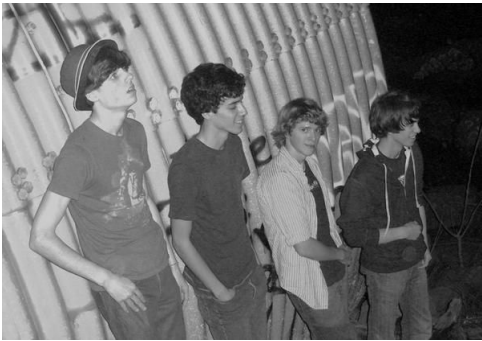
8 Inch Betsy- Chicago, IL
